Greetings from the Music Department!

It was Advent Sunday, December 2, 1873 when hymnist Frances Havergal first saw clearly the blessedness of true consecration. She saw it as a flash of electric light, and what you see you can never unsee. There must be full and total surrender before there can be full blessedness.

Not long after that experience Frances found herself spending several days with ten people in a house, some of them unconverted. Others in the group were Christians, but not fully committed to Christ. "Lord, give me all in this house," she prayed. She went to work witnessing to the group, and before she left all ten yielded their lives to Christ. On the last night of her visit – too excited to sleep – wrote the lyrics to this great consecration hymn.

Take my life and let it be consecrated Lord to Thee.
Take my hands and let them move,
At the impulse of Thy love, at the impulse of Thy love.

She also wrote of the Lord taking her feet, her voice, her lips, and her love.....dedicating all to Christ. I love the last verse:

Take my love, my God, I pour at Thy feet its treasure store.
Take myself and I will be ever, only, all for Thee.
Ever, only, all for Thee.

It is my prayer that we all strive for that kind of consecration to our Lord and Savior, remembering after this Easter season, all He has done for us.







The #MeToo Movement and the Church with Dr. Mimi Haddad

Tuesday, May 7, 2019 from 7:00 PM - 8:30 PM

Fuller Texas is pleased to present a lecture "The #MeToo Movement and the Church" with Dr. Mimi Haddad.

Dr. Mimi Haddad is president of CBE International. She is a graduate of the University of Colorado and Gordon Conwell Theological Seminary and holds a PhD in historical theology from the University of Durham. She is author of *Is Gender Equality a Biblical Ideal?* with Sean Callaghan. Dr. Haddad is an adjunct assistant professor of historical theology at Fuller Theological Seminary and Zinzendorf School of Doctoral Studies. Mimi has taught for colleges and seminaries around the world. She currently serves as a gender consultant for World Vision International, World Relief, and Beyond Borders. Mimi and her husband, Dale, live in Minneapolis/St. Paul, Minnesota.

This lecture will discuss how the #MeToo movement demonstrates the global power imbalances between men and women not only in culture but also in the church. Will also consider how churches can prevent harassment and abuse today while learning from Christians through history who have advanced the Gospel, justice and the dignity of women and men created in God's image. This event is free and open to all denominations.
